Lelebrate the Waveney & Blyth

Welcome to our third year of creative events celebrating what is so special about this part of East Anglia.

Last year over 1000 people took part – so join one of the 22 events on offer this year and swell our ranks!

Our main project for 2013 has been about five of the area's iconic birds: the bittern, bearded tit, barn owl, marsh harrier and nightingale.

To help our young people become more aware of birds and the environment we joined forces with the RSPB, Suffolk Wildlife Trust, and Norfolk & Suffolk Biodiversity Partnerships, and took a team made up of bird experts Steve & Kathy Piotrowski, RSPB poet Matt Howard, and Nutmeg Puppet Company's Meg Amsden into local schools. These sessions were the starting point for a fabulous children's entertainment – see opposite.

A native birds theme links many of this year's events and another thread weaving through many of the walks is the Angles Way. We have joined up with Norfolk County Council's Trails Team to link in with this wonderful long-distance footpath that passes along the Waveney Valley and has recently been 'refurbished' - see page 6 & 7. These events only happen because of the energy and enthusiasm of our many volunteers, the practical and moral support of our partners, and the generous financial support of our funders. Particular thanks must go to the town coordinators, members of the walks committee, treasurer, secretary and membership secretary; and for Famous Five Birds, the support of our project patron Mark Cocker and wildlife photographer David Tipling, as well as Nathan Williamson, Pam Reed, Debra Hyatt, Mark Finbow of The Keeper's Daughter Theatre Company and the volunteers from Essex & Suffolk Water.

WALK THE WAVENEY & BLYTH

We have walks of various lengths and levels of accessibility inspired by and incorporating a range of creative activities. We can include only a brief outline here, so call the walk co-ordinator listed if you would like more details. End times and distances are approximate.

If you have known health or access issues please make sure the walk co-ordinator is made aware of these when you book.

For insurance purposes the cost includes temporary membership of Waveney & Blyth Arts for the duration of the advertised walk only, hence the additional charge of £1 for non-members. All children under 12 must be accompanied by a parent or carer and will be covered by their membership. Angles Way is a 93-mile walking trail following the county boundary of Norfolk and Suffolk, gently meandering from Great Yarmouth through to Thetford. After Breydon Water (near Great Yarmouth) Angles Way follows the Waveney Valley to the source of the river, passing through open countryside, broad river valleys, pretty villages and the ancient market towns of Beccles, Bungay, Harleston and Diss. The route then meets up with the Little Ouse at Knettishall Heath with a striking change in scenery as it winds through the heathland and woodland of the Suffolk Brecks before finishing in Thetford.


